



Miami Dolphins Head Coach Adam Gase, 12.17

On how he would rate Matt Moore's performance...

I thought he did a good job. The short week, we were just trying to put this thing together as clean as possible, get him to feel as comfortable as he possibly could. It's no secret it's been a while since he's started a football game in the regular season, so you just want to make sure he felt good coming into this game.

On what impressed him about Moore's performance...

I thought his command. We took some shots, too, and he hit them. (He) missed a couple that I know he wanted back, but (he) kept his head, kept plugging along. The run game wasn't exactly what we thought it was going to be. We thought maybe we'd have a little more success, but they did a good job as far as getting penetration and causing some problems for us. Jay (Ajayi) was running hard for us and he was trying to find some lanes, but we were just a little off in the run game.

On Moore's approach to the game...

He was great all week. It was interesting to see the roles kind of switch between those two guys and just how their personalities have just switched. It was pretty interesting to go through this week. Matt all of a sudden became all serious and Ryan (Tannehill) was joking around. It was an interesting process to go through.

On Cameron Wake's performance...

The defense did a great job. Just the turnovers, just causing problems, the pressure was relentless, guys were playing hard. I know there are a couple of things (Vance Joseph) is going to want to clean up. Those guys are perfectionists and want to make sure they do everything right. I know (Bilal) Powell had a good day and we just need to get tighter on some of those check-downs and tackle a little bit quicker. But there's a reason they're getting into those check-downs, because the coverage was pretty good outside and guys were keeping those receivers, the coverage was really tight.

On what ensuring a winning season means...

I don't know if we're really worried about final records or anything right now. We're trying to win one game at a time. I know I've said it before. It gets boring. But that's what it is. Our guys are focused on just making sure whatever opponent we have next, that we come out of that week 1-0.

On Xavien Howard's performance...

It looked like he was pretty good to me. He was competitive, got his hands on some balls. He looked like he never really left us. That was a surprise, when (Byron) Maxwell went out, that was the first thing that went through my head, "Alright, so, how many snaps is he actually going to get this game, considering we were only thinking he was going to get 15," and I know it was way over that.

On how reassuring it is to have a backup like Moore...

Well, it's really been our mantra all year. We've had quite a few guys go down and we've had some really good players go down and the entire team's had that next-man-up mentality. And no matter what the position's been, somebody's either stepped up or the rest of the guys have stepped up around him and made sure that all the pressure wasn't on one person and they're trying to do it as a unit. And whether it's been a team, special teams, defense, offense, that group has tried to pick it up.

On the television broadcast reporting Tannehill tore his MCL off the bone...

That's hard for me to answer. I didn't hear it. I just know whatever I told you guys is what I was told.

On Ajayi and Jarvis Landry both surpassing 1,000 yards on the season tonight...

Any time that you hit those numbers it's a great accomplishment. I think it's hard for either of those guys to focus on that right now. I know they've never spoken to me about it. I've never really heard them speak about it around their teammates. I think it's just one of those things that at the end of the year when your



season's over you may look back on it and say that was a number you were either shooting for or people thought they would get, but I don't know that either of those guys are worried about individual statistics at this point.

On why the team has a knack for big plays...

I think guys are just playing hard and on defense it seems like a lot of guys are in the right place at the right time and it just comes from effort and pursuit. And on special teams it just seems like the same guys show up over and over again, put themselves in position to when something like that happens, they end up getting a big play off of it. It just seems like (Mike Hull) seems to be the guy that's really making a huge impact on special teams, which he has been, it's just now it's resulting into points. Offensively, we had a couple opportunities where they were aggressive as far as what they were calling and we finally hit a couple there in the third quarter that swung the game for us.

On Wake's performance...

I think when you have a player of his ability that has played as long as he has, he has that knack for timing. It just seems like he knows when there are those moments in a game where if something could swing a game, he just seems to find that moment and make it happen. I know him intercepting (the ball), he's dropping into a zone blitz. Sometimes when you're a quarterback you just don't see that guy, you don't anticipate that guy being in that spot. A lot of times the defensive end just has to catch it. It was interesting; I was watching him catch balls in warm-ups thinking to myself, "Why is he catching balls in warm-ups?" And all of a sudden I look up and he picks one off. So maybe he knew something that I didn't.

On if the deep ball after stopping the Jets on fourth down was intentionally taking a shot...

No, that was just something we called. I was getting tired of just sitting back and trying to throw quick. It was just a good opportunity to start pushing the envelope a little bit and stop being so conservative.

On the confidence boost the game gives Moore...

I don't think there ever was a lack of confidence by Matt, ever, at least as long as I've known him. I think this team felt like whoever stepped into that role when Ryan went down was going to do a good job with what we asked him to do and they had a lot of confidence that the rest of the guys on offense would step up and make plays.

On the performance of Matt Moore...

Like I said last week, Matt prepares like he's the starting quarterback. Every week he's done that. For him to come in and play with the confidence he played with, to a lot of people it was unexpected, but for us it was something we already knew.

On reaching back to back 1,000 yards seasons...

For me, I've never really been the player to emphasize personal accomplishments. When you win, the accomplishments come. Honestly, 1,000 yards was a goal I set out for myself individually. It's something I expect to reach.

On the team's current 9-5 record...

This is an amazing feeling to be in the position that we are in. We are basically in control of our destiny. I can't remember in past years, how many Dolphins' teams we're above .500 at this point in the year. So for us to be where we are, it is a testament to the hard work we put in.

On the aggressive play-calling by the offense...

It was time for it. It was time for the receivers to be trusted a little bit more. Kenny Stills made a big play to start it off, and from there we kind of took over.

On his interception....

The receiver did a stutter and then took off. When I looked at him his eyes got big. Back when I played wide receiver, my eyes got big when I was about to catch the ball. I just tried to turn on (the speed) and play the ball. I came down with the ball.

On filling in for Byron Maxwell...

I just I had to play. I knew I would be over (Brandon Marshall) a lot. Sometimes you just have to go out there and play ball.

On containing Brandon Marshall...

It's a team effort. The coaches put us in good positions and we just tried to execute the game plan.

On the win...

It feels good. It's a division game so you throw out the records. They are a great team, this is a great place to play, and it's primetime ball. We knew they would come out and give us their best shot, we just tried to give ours.

Miami Dolphins QB Matt Moore, 12.18

On his performance tonight...

When you come out with the win, all is well. But there are some things we have to look at and clean up for sure. But overall I think communication was pretty good against a good defense. The execution was there for the most part. Again, there are some things to clean up. When you get a 'W' against a divisional team on the road, that's what you want.

On his feelings before the game...

There were some nerves. I'd be lying if I said there weren't some nerves. Maybe it showed early. We started off slowly, but then we got into a groove in the middle part of the game. But once we got going, all of that negative stuff wore off. A couple of guys made some big plays and then we got on a roll. Credit to those guys for getting us going. The blocked punt, Jarvis Landry's touchdown, all of it. It was pretty awesome down there getting stops at the goal line and then making something happen. Guys didn't give up. That made it easier on me.

On if the defense's focus on stopping the running game gave him opportunities...

Yes, like I said, it's a good front. There were opportunities. Then it turned into a pressure game midway through and we had to have some answers. We did. We wanted to run the ball and again it was tough. But it allowed us to make some plays in the passing game. Once those guys got the ball in their hands, it was pretty impressive.

On how he feels after starting a game after such a long time...

I'm fired up. It's a great feeling. We're definitely going to enjoy it. I'm going to enjoy it and get ready to get back to work. We have another game next week. Our focus will be to win that one, but it feels great.

On his week after having a child last Monday and getting a divisional win on the road tonight...

It's wild, but that's the way it goes.

On his conversations with Ryan Tannehill during the game...



He was awesome, and I expected it to be that way. We talked about a few little things like IDs on the defense, what he saw from the sidelines, how he saw the backside cornerback playing. 'Hey if you see this again, we could probably get this look.' Extremely helpful, and I expected that. That's who he is.

On the significance of a career-high four TDs in his first start in five years...

It's a team win. I didn't run 70 yards on Landry's touchdown. So credit the guys that made the plays. Is it a good thing? Absolutely. But there's no way that happens without those guys.

On the Kenny Stills play and the reaction after it...

We had max protection and they brought cover zero up. The defense wins those situations a lot of times. Just to execute the way we did...Kenny's running. We blocked as many as we could. They brought one extra. To hit it was a big play. I think it was a third down. So I was just fired up. It's good stuff.

On if he's been around a team like this who started slow, yet are winning despite many injuries...

No I haven't been around a team like this. Guys understand that they are truly on a team. We've had the 'Next Man Up' motto and guys have stepped up and filled in tons of ways. I think along the way all three phases have started to help each other out. Tonight that punt block sparked everything. Then we got the scoop and the score, which is a bonus. So it's good right now. We just need to keep the focus and keep moving forward.

On how playing the whole game tonight will help him next week and in the future...

All of the obvious reasons – the experience, the reps, seeing the looks and throwing the ball in the game – all of those things. We're going to learn from the film. That's going to give us some things to work on this week. Anytime you can get competitive snaps in this league, it's only going to make you better. So it should help moving forward.

On the nerves and the speed of the game...

I didn't notice the speed of the game. I knew what to expect from that perspective. But maybe I felt nerves a little bit. It's nice to complete your first ball. We had the quick out to MarQuis Gray, so that was good. But speed of the game was not an issue.

On what it means to be the backup for so long and to have the chance to lead this team to the playoffs with two more wins...

It's something. We're focused on one at a time. That's been our whole mindset. Obviously guys know what's on the table and the possibilities that are out there. But we're focused on one thing at a time. Like I said, we're going to enjoy this one and get back on the grind next week.

On if he had a chance to absorb this week...

There will definitely be time to reflect about this week tonight and tomorrow. I'll relax for a second and then get moving again. It's on to the next one, but there will be time for that for sure.

On his approach on the fact that he is the QB of a team very much in the playoff chase...

I don't know how to answer that other to say that we're focused on one game at a time. I think we've had the results we wanted because of the guys' mindset. That's also my mindset. One week at a time. Do everything you can to win one game and the rest will take care of itself.

On what has been the key to his success in the second half of the season...

Just grinding, just putting my head down and being the workhorse that I am and producing when my number is called. That's pretty much it.



On whether he expected to have so much success since he was considered a blocking tight end...
Anything they want me to do. I'm just doing my part, doing my job. Opportunities are there and it's coming, so I just produce when my number is called. Whatever my role is, I embrace it and I do whatever I can to help the team.

On what it says about the team that a lot of guys are stepping up...
We're competitors. Everybody is a competitor and we want to compete. That's pretty much it point blank. And (Coach) Gase always talks about the next man up and he preaches it, so guys are ready for that and when their number is called, they're just going out there and having fun and just doing what we love.

On how good it feels to come to New York and get a convincing win...
It's big, getting a division win and coming out here in an away game in the cold, it's good. It's something that we prepared all week for and we knew that we were facing a tough defense. It feels good to get a win on the road.

On his interception and sack...
We're having a lot of fun out there. Obviously, I'm not back in coverage very often, so that was a new one for me, but the ball was there. I had to go back to my linebacker days. I put my hands on it. Other than that, it was just a game where a lot of guys were making a lot of plays literally all over the field, special teams, offense, defense. We knew what kind of game it was going to be coming in. I think the guys prepared and we got a win.

On what he was thinking on the interception when the ball was in the air...
Just catch it. Funny enough, I work on catching more than probably most defensive ends, but you never know when that opportunity's going to be there. That was kind of one of the mantras of this week is, you don't know which play it's going to be, just make it when it comes. Whether it's a blocked punt, interceptions, sacks, you never know what it's going to be. You have to make sure you make the most of the opportunity.

On what impact Miami's pressure on the quarterback had on the game...
Every week I feel like, with the guys we have, that can be a tremendous part of our game—getting after the quarterback. Obviously, stopping the run and getting after the quarterback, playing aggressive, that's always going to be at the top of our list for things to do on Sundays. This week was no different. We didn't know exactly what type of front they were going to have. They had some guys banged up just like we do. Every play you have to beat the man across from you. Week-in and week-out that's our mentality. I know I can speak for everybody, I don't care who you put up there, we're going to do our best to beat you. I think [more] times than not that's going to be a successful play for us.

On scoring on his punt block....
I knew I got a piece of it. Then it was "See ball, get ball". As a defensive player, getting the scoop and score is our motto.

On being unblocked on his punt block...
I was surprised. But (Darren Rizzi) always tells us, don't come in there like you will get blocked because you never know who will come free. I was in the right place at the right time.

On how it feels to reach 1,000 rushing yards on the season...

I think that probably after this season when I look at it, it'll probably sink in a little bit more than it is right now, but just knowing how much it takes to get to 1,000 yards, I'm appreciative of the hard work that everyone has put in collectively, o-line, receivers, tight ends and myself included, just to be able to get to this point. So, I'm grateful.

On whether it was frustrating to run the ball against the Jets' defensive line...

Yeah, it was tough today. I mean, it's not excuses. I don't really care if they stack the box or not, I always try to produce and that's my mindset. It wasn't what we are capable of on the ground, but we got the win and that's what matters.

On his teammates having to calm him down when he got frustrated...

Like I said, I don't really care. All I see is just trying to make plays and make things happen.

On how good it feels to come to New York and get a win...

This is huge. These are games that are very meaningful right now, division games, trying to make the playoffs and we're in the hunt for it. We need to win games like this and we handled our business tonight. Now we're onto the Bills and we're going to make sure we do the same next week.

New York Jets Head Coach Todd Bowles, 12.17

On the injury to Jets QB Bryce Petty...

He has a chest injury. He is having more tests run tomorrow.

On what happened on the play where Petty was injured...

Two guys sandwiched him. They hit him pretty hard.

On why the Jets offensive line didn't move on the play, or if it was a botched snap count...

It was a bust in there as far as from the call and the snap count.

On how Petty played...

Not well enough to win. He made too many mistakes. He wasn't the only one. He had a lot of help. We didn't play very well.

On whether Petty had an X-ray...

The x-rays were negative. He'll have more tests run tomorrow.

On what Dolphins QB Matt Moore did to enable him to have success...

Not much. I don't think we covered very well.

On the Jets blown coverages on defense...

They weren't blown coverages. People just got beat.

(follow-up)

On if it's a speed issue with the Jets...

No.

On the Dolphins blocked punt...

We let a guy free on the edge.

On whether the game swung on the blocked punt...



It started to swing. There were about four or five minutes of bad football played right in the span. It started with that. There was a turnover after that. Then, a pass play after that. There were about four or five minutes where about 20 points were scored and the game got out of hand.

On the Jets losing two straight games on prime time television...

You don't explain. It's all on me. I did a terrible job getting these guys ready to play. I thought we were ready to play in the first half. In the second half, as a head coach of this team, that's not looking very good right now. It's all a reflection of me. I take full responsibility.

On if the team was not prepared...

They were prepared. When we play like that, it all falls on me. It starts at the top. I have to do a better job and they have to do a better job. But, it starts with me.

On how it's his fault if the team was prepared...

I'm the head coach of this ball club. Everything that happens falls on me.

On what went wrong...

You saw the game. There was a blocked punt. There was an interception. It was football. The football went bad for us in the second half and that starts with me. We have to play better.

On whether it is the responsibility of the QB when Miami is having so many free unblocked pass rushers...

A lot of that falls on him as well.

On if it can be dangerous for a young, inexperienced QB to play because they don't sense the pass rush...

It's football. Any quarterback is in a dangerous situation.
(follow-up)

On whether Petty has a good sense of the pass rush...

It's any quarterback. It wasn't just Bryce. It was about up front. Bryce isn't the only one to blame on this one. It's the whole offense.

(follow-up)

On the pocket presence of Petty...

At times, it was good. At times, it wasn't good.

On what he can do better personally...

I can sure coach better and make sure the coaches and players understand exactly what's going on play-by-play. When we're not winning ball games, it starts with me. I take full responsibility. I will be a better coach and we'll be a better team.

On how he would grade himself at 4-10...

Like a 4-10 team. Not good.

On his message to the team after tonight's game...

The things we did right in the first half, the things we did good...they did the same things in the second half and we didn't do them well. Whoever shows up tomorrow or the next day ready to play football and wanting to win these next couple of ball games, we're going to play with the guys that we have. We'll all stay together. We're not making any excuses. We're going to play.

On if Jets QB Ryan Fitzpatrick would play if Petty can't go...

We'll discuss that tomorrow. We haven't gotten into any of that. I'll wait for the tests and then we'll have meetings tomorrow.

On the Jets having seemingly the same issues every week...



It's different guys every week. Like I said, I'm not doing a good job.

On whether the Jets have personnel issues on the team...

I'm the head coach of this football team. If you're out there, you're here to play. We have to coach guys to get ready to play. We have guys out there that need to make plays. We have to coach better and they have to play better. That's really all it is.

On whether he needs more talented players...

No. We need to play better structured football.

On if he is worried about his job security...

I don't worry about my job security. It falls on me when I signed my contract.

On any jets injuries...

Leonard Williams has a chest injury. (Brian) Winters has a shoulder. And Darron Lee had a left eye.

On if any of those injuries were serious...

They have to get tests run. It's too early to tell.

On whether the play of Jets RB Bilal Powell was a bright spot...

He showed effort, but I have no bright spots.

On if Powell's 10 catches displays the Jets are dumping off to the backs too much...

If the other guys aren't open and they're getting pressure, no.

New York Jets QB Ryan Fitzpatrick, 12.17

On Bryce Petty's injury...

It looked like he took a pretty big hit on both sides. I wasn't sure whether he got the wind knocked out of him or what, but he wasn't able to come back in the game.

On the offense's inability to keep the momentum following the first drive...

We had a couple of penalties and we had a couple of good plays that got called back on penalties. That set us behind 1st & 20. We had a couple of decent drives where one ended in a turnover. There's a few things that popped up that need to be cleaner on our end.

New York Jets WR Robby Anderson, 12.17

On how tough a loss this was...

Every loss is a tough loss. It's not a good feeling or good taste in our mouths. Regardless of how it goes, it hurts.

On Bryce Petty's injury...

I didn't know that it was Bryce that got hurt. When I caught the ball I just saw someone lying there. Then I realized it was him and went to make sure he was okay.

On what he saw from Bryce Petty today...

He's giving his all. You've got to respect that. You're going to make mistakes, but we all make mistakes. I made mistakes, everybody does. But when he's out there giving his all and fighting you've got to respect that.

On what he's been able to show this late in the season...



I've shown that I can contribute and that I belong. I know coming in a lot of people slated me out and didn't have a lot of faith in me, but that's just motivation for me. I showed that I belong and I'm going to continue to work hard so I can stay here as long as possible. I'm giving my all with every opportunity I get.

New York Jets DE Muhammad Wilkerson, 12.17

On the game...

At the end of the day, they made more plays than us. We didn't get any turnovers, we turned the ball over, and we just didn't ever get in that groove. All three phases weren't clicking. That's what caused us to lose the game.

On if the game snowballed in the third quarter...

Coach came in and he told us. We went down twenty points in about four minutes. They blocked a punt and got turnovers. Like I said, we could never get in a groove. If we could get off the field on third down, they just made plays and we didn't.

On Coach Bowles taking all the blame...

It's everybody. As coaches, you want to take the blame. But it's the coaches and the players. They're coaching but we're out there playing. We have to do a better job of executing. All eleven guys have to make plays. At the end of the day that's it.

New York Jets RB Bilal Powell, 12.17

On the offense's play in the first half...

We just caught them in looks. (We made) pretty good play calls that we've been practicing. We got the looks that we wanted and it was good play calls.

On how tough this lost was...

You always want to win. Unfortunately, we got a couple of turnovers and a good play given up. The game got out of hand before you knew it. It's crazy because you see guys fight every day; fight on the field. It's just unfortunate that we came out with a loss.

On his thoughts on being 4-10...

No one wants to be 4-10. You look around, we have a talented team. Hopefully we can just finish the season out strong.

On how he played...

Whenever my number is called, I just take full advantage of my opportunity. The offensive line did a tremendous job out there. (They) opened up holes for me. Like I said, we got into some formations and some looks that we were able to execute against the defense.

New York Jets QB Bryce Petty, 12.17

On how he feels physically...

I'll be good. Little sore right now, but I'll be fine.

On what occurred with the offensive line on the play he was injured and whether he anticipated the snap was coming...

No, just a miscommunication. But that's part of football. That stuff is going to happen. Robby (Anderson) made a great play. It was just unfortunate that I had Cameron Wake and (Ndamukong) Suh right there. But, hey, if I can take hits from those guys, I think I'll be alright.



On whether the snap came earlier than he anticipated...

No, it was just a miscommunication. It was definitely on me to get that play. The best part about it was, was that Robby made a great play and it was a positive from it.

On if his chest took the brunt of the hit...

Yes.

On if he has further plans to evaluate his chest tomorrow...

I think CT scans to make sure there is no punctured lung or anything, a bruised lung.

On how he felt he performed...

I saw the field really well tonight. I think they were mixing up a bunch of coverages and blitzes and things like that and that's something I knew probably going into the game, so, I was excited about this game. To see the growth from kind of where I started to where I am – just miss on a couple throws. Had the one pick to Wake where he dropped right out in front of my curl route there and that's the growth part that I have to know. I thought I saw things really well. That was my one mistake. I think I was just a yard-and-a-half off on the deep balls and that's the difference between talking about six points and talking about an interception or an incomplete pass or whatever else. Those throws are there, though. Those things are going to be there. We were just off tonight.

On his decision to target Bilal Powell often in the first half...

The guy just gets open, especially with as much zone as they were playing. I think that's where he does his work – underneath. (He's) kind of an outlet for me. When things aren't there deep then we want check it down and he's really good at that.

On what he saw on the touchdown pass to Anderson...

That was a perfect play call. We had the 'kill' on, so, it was a run to a pass. Saw what we needed to see and Robby ran a great route really fast through the middle there. Again, that was something that I had seen on tape of knowing exactly where to go with the ball when they bring this. So, I was really happy about that. (Anderson) caught it and scored. We just have to keep making those plays. It's on me for, again, having those lulls. We have to keep fighting and keep making those plays.

On what led to free rushers...

Aside from the fact that they just have a really good defensive line. But yes, we'll go look at it on tape. There's definitely, probably, some things there as far as seeing a shell of a defense and understanding who's coming down, who's not, who's liable to blitz right here. Those things are definitely ones that I can continue to look at and make sure that everything is protected and I'm good.

On the lack of completions to Brandon Marshall...

I don't know. You're looking at the problem. It's on me. I can make those throws. I've made those throws since before camp. It's not a timing issue. I just have to hit him. He's getting open. They weren't doing too much doubling on him tonight to where we had those shots. There were a couple of plays that were there to be made and I didn't make them. That's the sucky part of it, but the good part of it is, we're going to make those plays. They're there to be made and we're going to make them. It just wasn't our night tonight.

On how close tonight was to being an ideal start...

We were moving the ball really well today. I came out (and) the nerves were fine. (During) the National Anthem they were hitting pretty good, but then as soon as we went out there it was exactly what I wanted was that they simmered pretty quick and then I was able to play football. I think that was a good thing because it's starting to get to the point now where, 'OK, we're starting now and this is where I want to be.' Each start will get better.

On how he felt throwing the football before returning from his injury...

I felt good. They were asking about taking breathes and things like that. It wasn't too bad. I couldn't take a deep breath, but as far as breathing normally, I was fine. And then I started to throw to (Austin Seferian-



Jenkins) to make sure everything was good and those three throws, I probably couldn't have thrown it much past where he was. It was just a pretty sharp, burning pain, I guess, there right in my chest. Getting everything checked out today, which was great. I'll get more tests done tomorrow and then should be good to go.

On if he'll receive additional tests to evaluate whether it's a bruised lung or a punctured lung...

Bruised lung, punctured lung, something like that. I don't know too much medical stuff.

On if he can take a deep breath...

Yes. Should be good.

On being 4-10...

Nobody expected this, but this is life. There's a lot of things that happen in life that you don't expect. You just have to be able to roll with it. There's a lot of adversity that these guys in this building are growing from. It's definitely not how we want it. It's definitely not how we know we can play and produce. But at the same time, we're going to keep fighting. Each week is a new week. It doesn't matter what happened last week. It's a one-game week. We're going to continue to get better, learn from this, learn from our mistakes. Excited about next week.

New York Jets WR Brandon Marshall, 12.17

On whether Miami's defense showed anything different in the second half...

No, actually. They gave us more opportunities, but we weren't able to connect.

On how he would assess Bryce Petty's performance...

I would have to watch film. I didn't even see him get hit. I just looked back and he was laying on the ground. You don't get to see everything out there when you're playing, but I would say none of us really played well when you lose 34-13 or whatever the score was. It's not all about one player.

On how Petty has improved game to game...

I'm not going to sit up here and give a Bryce assessment. None of us have played well this season, that's what I'd say. We've only won four games, so we've lost – stunk it up.
