### CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:

- Played in 11 career games with 4 starts.
- 103 carries for 800 yards (7.8 avg.) and 8 TDs.
- 27 receptions for 197 yards (7.3 avg.) and 3 TDs.
- His 7.8 yards per carry average in 2023 set the record for the best in NFL history by a running back with at least 100 carries in a season:

### 2023 (MIAMI):

- Played in 11 games with 4 starts.
- Inactive for 2 games.
- Missed 4 games after being placed on injured

reserve on Oct. 11 and activated on Nov. 18.

- 103 carries for 800 yards (7.8 avg.) and 8 TDs.
- 27 receptions for 197 yards (7.3 avg.) and 3 TDs.

**VS. DENVER (9/24):** 18 carries for 203 yards (11.3 avg.) and 2 TDs; 4 receptions for 30 yards (7.5 avg.) and 2 TDs.

- His 203 rushing yards and 4 total TDs both were the most in a game by a rookie in franchise history.
- Tied the franchise record for most total TDs (4) and points scored (24) in a game.
- Scored on an 8-yard run to give Miami a 14-0 lead in the 1st quarter for his 1st career TD.
- Caught a 4-yard TD pass from QB Tua Tagovailoa with 10:16 left in the 2nd quarter.
- Caught a 10-yard TD pass from QB Tua Tagovailoa on the 1st play of the 4th quarter.
- Scored on a 68-yard run to extend Miami's lead to 70-20 in the 4th quarter.

**AT BUFFALO (10/1):** 8 carries for 101 yards (12.6 avg.) and 2 TDs; 3 receptions for 19 yards (6.3 avg.).

- Became the 4th player in NFL history to score 6 touchdowns in his 1st 3 NFL games, joining RB Kareem Hunt (2017), RB Billy Sims (1980) and RB Dutch Sternaman (1920).
- Became the 4th NFL rookie since 1970 to total at least 6 touchdowns in a 2-game span, joining RB Doug Martin (2012), RB Mike Anderson (twice, 2000) and WR Randy Moss (1998).
- Became the first Dolphins player to rush for 100+ yards in back-to-back games since RB Kenyan Drake in 2017.
- Became the 21st NFL player since the merger to have at least 2 100-yard rushing performances in his first 3 career games and was the first NFL player to do this since RB Kareem Hunt in 2017.

**VS. N.Y. GIANTS (10/8):** 11 carries for 151 yards (13.7 avg.) and 1 TD; 1 reception for 14 yards (14.0 avg.).

- Scored on a 76-yard TD run with 10:02 left in the 2nd quarter.
- His 76-yard TD run is tied for the 5th longest in Dolphins history.
- Became the 5th different Dolphins player to have 3 straight 100-yard rushing games, joining RB Ricky Williams (4 different times), RB Ronnie Brown, RB Reggie Bush and RB Jay Ajayi.
- Is the 3rd NFL rookie in the past 35 years to have 3 consecutive games of 100+ rushing yards and a rushing touchdown, joining RB Mike Anderson (Denver, 2000) and RB Barry Sanders (Detroit, 1989).

**AT BALTIMORE (12/31):** 14 carries for 107 yards (7.6 avg.); 4 receptions for 30 yards (7.5 avg.) and 1 TD.

- Caught a 1-yard TD pass from QB Tua Tagovailoa in the 4th quarter.
- It was his 4th 100-yard rushing game of the season, tying the team rookie record.

### BEFORE THE NFL

#### COLLEGE (TEXAS A&M):

- 3-year letterman (2020-22) and 1-year starter.
- Also participated in track and field and became the first male Aggie since 2014 to earn All-American honors in the 100m and 200m. Also earned 1st-team All-American honors as a member of the 4x100m team.

**CAREER:** Played in 30 games with 11 starts; 369 carries for 2,376 yards (6.4 avg.) and 21 TDs; 65 receptions for 554 yards (8.5 avg.) and 5 TDs; 20 kickoff returns for 613 yards (30.6 avg.) and 2 TDs.

**JUNIOR (2022):** Started 10 games; 196 carries for 1,102 yards (5.6 avg.) and 8 TDs; 36 receptions for 196 yards (5.4 avg.) and 3 TDs; 11 kickoff returns for 312 yards (28.4 avg.) and 1 TD.

- 1st-team All-SEC at running back and all-purpose player.
- His 161.0 all-purpose yards per game led the SEC and ranked 4th nationally.

**SOPHOMORE (2021):** Played in all 12 games with 1 start; 130 carries for 910 yards (7.0 avg.) and 9 TDs; 24 receptions for 261 yards (10.9 avg.) and 1 TD; 9 kickoff returns for 301 yards (33.4 avg.) and 1 TD.

- His 7.0 yards per carry led the SEC and ranked 11th nationally.
- His 11 total TDs led the team.

**TRUE FRESHMAN (2020):** Played in 8 games; 43 carries for 364 yards (8.5 avg.) and 4 TDs; 5 receptions for 97 yards (19.4 avg.) and 1 TD.

#### HIGH SCHOOL (FORT BEND MARSHALL HS – MISSOURI CITY, TEXAS)

- Finished his career with 185 carries for 2,097 yards (11.3 avg.) and 38 TDs along with 32 receptions for 694 yards (21.7 avg.) and 10 TDs.
- Also participated in track and field and was the 2020 Gatorade Texas Boys Track & Field Athlete of the Year.
