Wade Harman joined the Miami Dolphins as a senior assistant in 2023.

The 2023 season marks Harman's 26th in the NFL. He most recently served as tight ends coach for the Denver Broncos from 2019-21. Harman has spent 22 seasons in the NFL coaching tight ends, including multiple Pro Bowlers.

From 2019-20, Harman helped Broncos tight end Noah Fant set a record for most receptions (102) and receiving yards (1,235) by a tight end through his first two seasons. Fant set the team rookie tight end records for receptions (40) and receiving yards (562) and was named to the PFWA All-Rookie Team in 2019.

Prior to Denver, Harman spent five seasons in Atlanta. In those five seasons, the Falcons' offense ranked third in the NFL in total offense (384.4), fifth in scoring (24.2) and eighth in sacks allowed. In 2016 the Falcons made the playoffs for the first time since 2012 and defeated the Green Bay Packers in the NFC Championship. Under his tutelage, Falcons tight end Austin Hooper was selected to his first Pro Bowl appearance in 2018. Hooper totaled 71 receptions for 660 yards (9.3 avg.) and four touchdowns that season.

Harman spent 15 seasons with the Baltimore Ravens from 1999-2013. He was the only coach that was part of both of the team's Super Bowl Championships – winning Super Bowl XXXV for the 2000 season and Super Bowl XLVII for the 2012 season. He tutored tight end Todd Heap, who earned two consecutive Pro Bowl nods under Harman (2002-03). He also coached Hall of Fame tight end Shannon Sharpe (2000-01), who surpassed Ozzie Newsome to become the NFL record holder for receptions and receiving yards by a tight end.

His NFL coaching career began with the Minnesota Vikings, where he spent two seasons (1997-98) as a coaching assistant and helped tutor the offensive line.

Prior to the NFL, Harman served as offensive coordinator at Morningside College and an offensive coach at the University of the Pacific.

Harman played linebacker at Drake University and Utah State and began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Utah State. He earned his undergraduate degree at Drake in computer science and his master's degree from Utah State in health, physical education and recreation.

A Corydon, Iowa, native, he and his wife, Angie, have three children – Madison, Rylee and Hunter.
