DOLPHINS WIN FIRST BLACK FRIDAY GAME AND IMPROVE TO 8-3

- The Dolphins are 8-3 for the second consecutive season. The last time Miami opened back-to-back seasons 8-3 was in 2000-01.
- Miami is now 12-3 in its past 15 games against the Jets, including wins in five of the past six.
- The Dolphins have now won three of their past four games at MetLife Stadium.
 - Miami is 9-5 in their 14 matchups at MetLife Stadium with the N.Y. Jets since the venue opened in 2010.
- This is Miami's second AFC East road victory of the season after they also won at New England in Week 2. It's just the third time in the past decade that Miami has won multiple divisional games on the road (2016 and 2021).
- It is Miami's second all-time victory on a Friday. The Dolphins also defeated the N.Y. Jets in the final game of the regular season on Friday, Dec. 16, 1983.
- The Dolphins have now won 22 of the past 31 games started by **QB Tua Tagovailoa**, dating back to Nov. 21, 2021. It is the third-best win percentage (.710) among NFL starting QBs (min. 15 starts) in that span.

HOLLAND RECORDS THIRD-LONGEST PICK-SIX IN DOLPHINS HISTORY JUST BEFORE HALFTIME

- **S Jevon Holland** intercepted a Hail Mary attempt by Jets **QB Tim Boyle** on the final play of the first half and returned it 99 yards for a touchdown.
- It was the first score of Holland's career and Miami's second pick-six of the season after **LB Jerome Baker** had a 22-yard one in Week 7 vs. Philadelphia.
- Holland now has five career interceptions.
- The 99-yard return was the third-longest interception return in Dolphins history:

DEFENSE LIMITS JETS TO 159 TOTAL YARDS AND ONLY 29 RUSHING YARDS

- Miami allowed just 29 rushing yards on 10 carries to the Jets today.
 - It was the fewest rushing yards allowed by Miami in a game since Dec. 11, 2017 vs. New England, when they allowed 25.
 - The 29 rushing yards were the fewest by the N.Y. Jets in a game since Nov. 26, 2006, when they had 27 rushing yards vs. the Texans. It was tied for the 10th-fewest rushing yards in a game in Jets history.

- The Dolphins have held their opponent to under 300 yards in four straight games and six of the last seven.
 - Last time Miami did this was a four-game streak from Nov. 28, 2021 to Dec. 27, 2021.
- The Dolphins have now allowed less than 110 rushing yards in the past 10 straight games. The last time the Dolphins had such a streak was from Oct. 17, 2021 to Dec. 27, 2021.
 - It is tied for the longest such streak in franchise history with 10-game runs from Oct. 17, 2021 to Dec. 27, 2021 and from Sept. 5, 1993 to Nov. 21, 1993.
 - The streak is also the longest in the NFL this season.
- Since Week 2, the Dolphins are third in the NFL in rushing defense (78.8), fifth in total defense (292.4), fifth in first down allowed (17.8) and second in yards per carry allowed (3.4).

DOLPHINS TOTAL SEVEN SACKS, 12 QB HITS AND TWO INTERCEPTIONS

- The Dolphins totaled seven sacks today for the second time this season, after also recording seven sacks in Week 5 vs. the N.Y. Giants.
 - It marks the first time since 1998 that Miami has had two games with 7+ sacks in the same season.
 - The Dolphins recorded eight sacks each in the Sept. 13, 1998 win vs. Buffalo and on Dec. 6, 1998 at Oakland.
 - Miami's sacks today came from **DT Christian Wilkins** (2.0), **DE Emmanuel Ogbah** (1.5), **DT Da'Shawn Hand** (1.0), **DT Zach Sieler** (1.0), **LB Jaelan Phillips** (1.0) and **DT Raekwon Davis** (0.5).
 - Phillips extended his sack streak to five games, which is the longest sack streak by a Dolphins player since **DE Emmanuel Ogbah** had a sack in six straight games from Oct. 4, 2020 to Nov. 15, 2020.
 - It's the third longest active streak in the league this season.
 - All four of Miami's defensive tackles on the roster recorded at least half a sack today.
 - Wilkins' two sacks give him 6.5 for the season, surpassing his previous career high of 4.5 set in 2021.
 - It was just the second multi-sack game of Wilkins' career. He also had two sacks in the Week 6 win vs. Carolina this season.
 - It was the second game this season Ogbah had at least 1.5 sacks after he also recorded 1.5 sacks in Week 5 vs. the N.Y. Giants.
 - Hand's sack was his first as a Dolphin and the first he has recorded since Nov. 11, 2018 at Chicago as a member of the Lions.
 - It was Sieler's fifth sack of the season, which is a career high.
 - The Dolphins have now had multiple sacks in eight straight games.
 - The last time Miami had a streak of at least eight games with multiple sacks was Nov. 6, 2022 to Sept. 1, 2023.
 - It's tied for the third-longest multi-sack streak in team history.
 - Miami has recorded at least one sack in every game this season.
- The Dolphins also had 11 quarterback hits today, which is tied for the third-most in a Dolphins game in the past decade.
 - The only games Miami has had more than 11 quarterback hits in the past decade have also come this season, with 13 in Week 3 vs. Denver and 12 in Week 5 vs. the N.Y. Giants.
- In addition to Holland's interception, **LB Jerome Baker** nabbed his second of the season in the fourth quarter off N.Y. Jets **QB Tim Boyle**.
 - Baker has a career-high two interceptions this season. He also had a 22-yard interception return for a touchdown in Week 7 at Philadelphia.

WADDLE AND HILL EACH TOP 100 YARDS RECEIVING

- **WR Jaylen Waddle** led the Dolphins with 114 receiving yards on eight receptions (14.3 avg.) today while **WR Tyreek Hill** had nine receptions for 102 yards (11.3 avg.) and one touchdown.
- It marked the second time this season that Hill and Waddle topped 100 yards in the same game. They also did so in Week 8 vs. New England.
- Hill and Waddle have now topped 100 yards in the same game six different times since becoming teammates in 2022.
 - Prior to that, Miami hadn't had two 100+ yard receivers in the same game since 2016.

HILL GOES OVER 1,300 RECEIVING YARDS FOR THE SEASON

- Hill becomes the fourth player in NFL history with at least 1,300 receiving yards in his team's first 11 games of a season and has the third-most receiving yards in league history through 11 games:

- Hill extended his league lead in receiving yards (1,324) and receiving touchdowns (10).
- He now has 6+ receptions and 60+ receiving yards in six consecutive games.
- Hill becomes the first Dolphins player since **WR Mike Wallace** in 2014 to have double-digit touchdown receptions in a season.
 - He has a receiving TD in nine of 11 games this year, including six of his past seven.
- Hill now has seven games with 100+ receiving yards and 1+ touchdown this season, which leads the NFL.
- His seven 100-yard receiving games this season are tied for the second-most in team history. Hill also had seven in 2022:

- Today marked the 14th 100-yard game of Hill’s tenure with the Dolphins, which is fourth-most in team history.

WADDLE SETS FRANCHISE RECORD FOR MOST RECEIVING YARDS IN FIRST THREE NFL SEASONS

- Waddle went over the 3,000 career receiving yards plateau today and became Miami’s all-time receiving yards leader for the first three seasons of a career:

- He is just 309 yards shy now of becoming the first player in Dolphins history to post three consecutive seasons with 1,000 receiving yards.
- Waddle has 50+ receiving yards in five of his past six games and 5+ receptions in five of his past seven contests.

MOSTERT SCORES HIS 14TH AND 15TH TOUCHDOWNS OF THE SEASON

- **RB Raheem Mostert** led the Dolphins today with 20 carries for 94 yards (4.7 avg.) and two touchdowns.
- His first touchdown came on a 13-yard run in the fourth quarter to give Miami a 27-6 lead.
- Mostert scored again on a 34-yard dash with 3:35 left in the game to extend Miami’s lead to 34-13.
- It was Mostert’s third consecutive game with 85+ rushing yards and he now has 50+ scrimmage yards in nine of 11 games played this season.
- Mostert leads the NFL with 13 rushing touchdowns and is second behind San Francisco’s Christian McCaffrey with 15 total touchdowns. He has scored a touchdown in eight of Miami’s 11 games this year.
- At the end of today’s game, Mostert’s 785 rushing yards this season lead the AFC and are second in the NFL:

TAGOVAILOA EXTENDS TOUCHDOWN STREAK TO 20 GAMES

- **QB Tua Tagovailoa** threw a 7-yard touchdown pass to **WR Tyreek Hill** in the second quarter, extending his streak to 20 straight contests with a touchdown pass.
 - The streak is the longest active streak in the NFL and is the second-longest streak in Dolphins history:

- It marks the second straight year he's topped 3,000 passing yards on the season.
- Tagovailoa also moved into fourth place on the team's all-time career passing yards chart today:

- Tagovailoa is now 3-0 in his three career starts against the N.Y. Jets and is now 10-5 all-time as a starter in AFC East games.

DOLPHINS DEFENSE HAS STELLAR FIRST HALF

- Miami allowed just 47 total yards, two first downs and zero offensive points in the first half of today's win.
- The two first downs allowed in the first half were tied for the fewest allowed by Miami in the first half of a game since at least 2000, and were the fewest allowed in the first half by the Dolphins since they allowed two at Chicago on Oct. 19, 2014.
- It was the first time this season Miami did not allow the opposing offense to score in the first half of a game. Miami did that twice in 2022, vs. Houston on Nov. 27, 2022 and vs. New England on Sept. 11, 2022.
- The 47 total yards were the fewest allowed in the first half of a game for Miami since Nov. 27, 2022 vs. Houston, when the Texans had just 32 first-half yards.

- Prior to leaving the game with an injury, **LB Jaelan Phillips** recorded three tackles for loss, a pass defended and a sack.
 - Phillips is the third different Dolphins player to record at least three tackles for loss in a game this season, joining **LB Andrew Van Ginkel** (three at Buffalo in Week 4) and **DT Zach Sieler** (three vs. N.Y. Giants in Week 5).
- **LB Bradley Chubb** had two quarterback hits today and has a QB hit in nine of Miami's 11 games played this season.
- **CB Xavien Howard** recorded a pass defended for the third consecutive game.
- **K Jason Sanders** connected on both of his field goal attempts, including a 54-yarder in the third quarter. It was tied for the third-longest make of his career. He made a 56-yarder on Nov. 8, 2020 at Arizona and a 55-yarder on Dec. 11, 2022 at the L.A. Chargers.
- **DT Christian Wilkins** has a quarterback hit in seven straight games and in nine of Miami's 11 games this year.
- Miami scored a touchdown on a 13-yard run by **RB Raheem Mostert** with 14:55 left in the game to take a 27-6 lead.
 - The touchdown drive spanned 15 plays for 92 yards, taking 9:02 off the clock. It was the longest touchdown drive the Dolphins have had since Jan. 1, 2012, when they had a 12:29 drive – the longest in team history – ending in a touchdown against the Jets.
