BAKER SCORES HIS SECOND CAREER TOUCHDOWN ON A PICK-SIX

- With 4:02 remaining in the third quarter, **LB Jerome Baker** caught a pass deflected by **CB Kader Kohou** and raced 22 yards to the end zone to tie the game at 17-17.
- It was the second touchdown of Baker's career after he scored on a 25-yard interception return on Nov. 4, 2018 vs. the N.Y. Jets.
- It was the fourth interception of Baker's career and his first since Nov. 7, 2021 vs. Houston.
- Miami's last defensive score was a 16-yard fumble return for a touchdown by Howard on Nov. 27, 2022 vs. Houston.
- Baker was also the game's leading tackler with 11 stops (six solo) today, including one for a loss.
 - He has at least one tackle in all 89 games played of his NFL career (includes postseason)

CHUBB TOTALS TWO SACKS; PHILLIPS ADDS ONE

- **LB Bradley Chubb** had two sacks this evening, including a strip-sack of **QB Jalen Hurts** in the first quarter. The fumble was recovered by **DT Christian Wilkins** and led to a Dolphins field goal.
 - Chubb's second sack of the game came in the third quarter.
- Chubb has now recorded three sacks in the past two weeks and four this season.
 - It's the third consecutive game Chubb has recorded a tackle for loss.
- The forced fumble was the ninth of Chubb's career and his second this season. He also forced a fumble on Sept. 17, 2023 at New England on Sunday Night Football.
- Chubb tied a career-high with seven tackles tonight.
- **LB Jaelan Phillips** sacked Hurts on a first-down play with 39 seconds remaining in the first half, forcing the Eagles to let time expire and go into halftime.
 - On the play, Phillips was lined up on four-time Pro Bowl **RT Lane Johnson**. According to PFF, it was the first sack allowed by Johnson since Week 11 of the 2020 season – a span of more than 1,100 snaps.
- With five more quarterback hits tonight, the Dolphins continue to lead the league in the statistic with 54 this season.

TAGOVAILOA TOPS YARDAGE AND TOUCHDOWN MILESTONES

- **QB Tua Tagovailoa** completed 23-of-32 passes (71.9 pct.) for 216 yards, one touchdown and one interception in tonight's game.
- His 27-yard touchdown pass to **WR Tyreek Hill** in the second quarter was the 67th touchdown pass of his career, surpassing **QB Jay Fiedler** for fourth-most in Dolphins history:

- Tagovailoa surpassed 10,000 career passing yards today, bringing his total to 10,107.
 - He is the fifth player in Dolphins history to total at least 10,000 career passing yards.
- Tagovailoa continues to lead the league in passing yards (2,092) and yards per attempt (9.1). He is tied for the NFL lead in passing touchdowns (15) and ranks second in passer rating (110.4).

- His 2,092 passing yards this year are the most in team history through the first seven games of a season:

HILL TOPS 10,000 CAREER SCRIMMAGE YARDS

- WR Tyreek Hill led the Dolphins in receptions (11) and receiving yards (88) today and had a 27-yard touchdown reception.
- The 88 yards this evening gives Hill 10,007 scrimmage yards for his career – 9,242 receiving and 765 rushing. He becomes the eighth active NFL player to top 10,000 career scrimmage yards, joining WR Julio Jones (13,795), WR DeAndre Hopkins (11,686), WR Mike Evans (10,903), TE Travis Kelce (10,883), RB Ezekiel Elliott (10,881), WR Davante Adams (10,164) and RB Derrick Henry (10,121).
- Hill’s 88 receiving yards gives him 902 for the season. He becomes the fourth player in NFL history and first in 62 years to record at least 900 receiving yards in his team’s first seven games of a season:

- Hill caught a 27-yard touchdown pass from Tagovailoa with 39 seconds remaining in the first half to make it a one-score game.
 - The touchdown reception marked his fourth straight primetime contest with a receiving touchdown.
- Hill leads the NFL with 902 receiving yards and seven receiving touchdowns this season.
- He now has 9,242 career receiving yards and has surpassed WR Davante Adams (9,236) for the most receiving yards since 2016, the year he entered the NFL.
