- Sacked QB Sam Darnold on 3rd-and-3 forcing a Jets missed field goal.

  - Is the 2nd Dolphins defensive player ever to catch a touchdown (Vern den Herder).
  - Is just the 3rd player NFL player in the 2010s decade to catch a TD and record a sack on the same game (Vita Vea and J.J. Watt).
  - Sacked QB Andy Dalton in the 3rd quarter.
